

CHILDREN

When communities suffer, children suffer more than anyone else. A community can be measured by how well children are protected and cared for. Our Children's Summer Camp aims to bring joy into the lives of at-risk children. Children also have a vast body of untapped creativity and energy which can be groomed to make them leaders of change. Programmes like N'KaNa, Eco-system based leadership and Child Leader Awards gives children the knowledge, skills, and platform to express their ideas and transform their own communities in the way they believe are necessary.

YOUTH

Our organization is completely volunteer-run and survives on the efforts of former and current Pondicherry University and t's affiliated college students. We believe in a system of two-way growth, in which we also provide youth with guidance and platforms for their ideas and creative projects, in exchange for their extensive work with at-risk children. We also recognize that certain community issues, such as alcohol use and suicide rates heavily impact youth and we are addressing these problems in our communities, with programmes like our Puducherry Youth Helpline and Puducherry Youth Helpline Mobile Application.

TYCL strives to involve the entire community, in accordance with the belief that children and youth have much to learn from older people in their community, as well as the belief that it is our duty to raise awareness and be engaged with intergenerational issues in our area through INAGI.






N'KaNa Mentoring

N'KaNa is an innovative children Mentorship program hat connects professionals with children in need and risk.

N'KaNa (My Sister and Brother) aims to bridge the gap in child development. This program consists of Mentee (Children), Mentor (Professional) and Volunteer (Liaison). The objective of this program is to find out the children from vulnerable group, support them intellectually which includes academic help, career guidance and professional mentorships to achieve their long term goal. The Mentor act as a role model and give them career related advice. The volunteer will act as a liaison between mentor and mentee. Currently N'KaNa process running with Nine children and Nine volunteers.











INCLUSIVE SUMMER CAMP

This year summer camp focused on exploring the 21st century creative life skills through Arts & Sports in order to let the children to practice them in day to-day life. The Children's summer camp was organized from 06th May 2019 to 11th May 2019 at School of Management Auditorium, Pondicherry University.

We explored the camp through learning:

- Traditional Art forms
- · Traditional sports
- Knowledge towards samplings
 and plantation
- Exploring flora and fauna at Arignar Anna Zoological Park, Vandalur

In summer camp, 90 children and 30 volunteers were participated. Children were divided into 8 groups with two volunteers to assist them througout the camp. There were around 300 students participated in the program. Jeithu Katuvom program was organised in Thanthai Higher Periyar Government Secondary Ariyankuppam and School, Government Higher Secondary School, Katterikuppam, Puducherry thrice in a year.







BAG DISTRIBUTION

YCL has a great concern for the quality and equality of students educational experiences. From the year 2010 onwards, we distribute school bags to the students in our partner who are in need. These school bags not only serve to alleviate any sense of material or personal inferiority, but also contribute to our students confidence to pursue a dignified education and further higher studies. INTERNATIONAL **CHILD RIGHTS DAY**

nternational Child Rights Day was observed on 20th November every year. TYCL has celebrated the 30th year of UNCRC by observing "Child Safety Week" from November 14th – 20th under the theme "Prevention" of substance use, Sexual exploitation and education understanding family situation and parents struggle" in order to build children as strong personnel and knowledge-based citizens in the society. The sessions was handled by the eminent speakers, Dr. Vidyaa Ramkumar, Chairperson, Sexual Harressment Cell at workplace, Government of Puducherry and Mrs.Vijaya Chandrasekaran, Life Skill Trainer, Satya Special School. Around 200 students have participated in an awareness program on "Child Safety" in Government Higher Secondary School in Villianur and Ariyankuppam.

hildren Creatothon aims to identify next gen innovators of Puducherry by reclaiming traditional art forms to address issues affecting them in their day - to - day lives. Creatothon provides an opportunity for Children to develop their skills, confidence, creativity and innovation for social change and strives to sensitize the city about child rights.







DISCUSSION ON NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY 2019

Puducherry Child Rights organizations organized a comprehensive round table discussion on the newly drafted National Education Policy-2019 at Satya Special School, Puducherry on 27th July 2019. The discussion was held between Government School Teachers, Central University Professors, Representatives from various Government Departments and child rights organizations, teachers working with children with disabilities and college students. The objective of this discussion

was to get collective suggestions and insights from the participants. The suggestions were submitted to the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) to modify the New Draft of National Education Policy to make it more accessible, affordable, safe, equitable, inclusive and provide quality holistic education to all the students of India.









YOUTH RESOURCE

Outh Resource has been an idea that has evolved by virtue of its need. Lots of youth need a space to come together and try out with their new ideas. Lot of talking, chatting and coffee need to happen for people to come and make things work out holistically. With this motive we had to rent a space and allocate Technological and Non-Technological resources, so that people can come, utilize, and take their ideas forward. Over the years, this space has hosted various meetings with TYCL volunteers and other organization heads and children. A community Library and Children Incubation house have been set up and a lot of Movie/Documentary screening happening at regular intervals. Usually Fellows of TYCL, Interns from Various educational institutions and industries are been hosted at YRC to utilize and make the best use of the space.

YOUTH HELPLINE




n the year 2019 - 2020, we have officially launched the Puducherry Youth Helpline Mobile application. An app exclusively designed to address the root causes of mental health issues. We have 181 app users and received 174 calls. A total of 355 young people of Puducherry in the age group of 14 to 35 years approached Youth Helpline, which is 123 % higher than last year. Out of 348 help seekers, nearly 40% (144) of them got directly benefited. Puducherry Youth Helpline team directly reached around 5,000+ youth through college/school/community/Youth club presentations and sensitized them on positive mental health with the assistance of psychiatrists from the National Mental Health Program, Govt. of Puducherry. We have reached around 1,00,000+ youth indirectly through our promotional materials, news ads, events, and targeted campaigns.





YOUTH HELPLINE MOBILE APP LAUNCH

Trust for Youth and Child Leadership (TYCL) has launched India's 1st ever Mobile Application for Youth Helpline jointly with Labour Department, Government of Puducherry. The mobile app has been developed exclusively for the young people of Puducherry in partnership with Amigo (Mobile App developer).

The Youth Helpline app is a dynamic platform that provides instant help to address grass root level issues faced by young people across India. The app connects youngsters to professionals who in-turn provide the required assistance through referrals within the robust network of professionals curated by TYCL. The platform enables the users to stay anonymous if they wish or reveal their identity if they are comfortable. Youth Helpline Mobile Application is now available in <u>Google Play</u> <u>Store</u>.





ECOSYSTEM-BASED LEADERSHIP

he Ecosystem Model will help the youth to confront their real time challenges and to make their lives meaningful and relevant for the present and the future.

Ecosystem-Based Helps Leadership Youth to Answer:

- Who am I? Where do I belong?
- How do I position myself in the growing community?
- What is my role in the community?
- Who are the trustworthy people in my community?
- Where does my inherent value come from?

This leadership model will support them to navigate towards their vision and help them to achieve their goals with a shift in selfdiscipline, conciseness, skills & behavioural economy, social recognition and systemthinking perspectives for self-transformation social change. Ecosystem-based and leadership program is a set of gamified



outcome-oriented activity with learning tools to help each individual to analyse and understand the ecosystem. Young people from different walks of life had participated in this two-day workshop which was held at Ilainargal Education Center, Auroville on 20th - 21st July 2019.

This year, we organized the Girls Lead Girls program at Tagore Government Arts and Science College. A diversified group of vulnerable girls are studying from different parts of Puducherry and Tamil Nadu. The workshop was organized on 2nd March - 4th March 2020.

OUTCOME AND IMPACT:

This program developed sixty-eight girls selfesteem and courage, and built their skills in setting boundaries, dealing with conflict, deescalating violence and facing the situation with confidence and made girls as strong defenders and knowledge-based resources in the society.
